#### Introduction to Japanese Literature

## International House

## **Buddy**

KSU arranges volunteer buddies to aid exchange students in settling into their new lives in Japan and to assist them with their studies. Buddies are initially asked to assist for the first two months after the exchange student's arrival, after which time, continuing to meet is the decision of the exchange student and tutor.





## **Club Activities**

To maximize their student life experience at KSU, exchange students are encouraged to participate in university club activities, especially more traditional clubs such as Tea Ceremony, Japanese Calligraphy, Flower Arrangement, Aikido, and Karate.
